C.E.R.T. Training (Community Emergency Response Team)

In conjunction with the Iberia Parish CERT Team, Love Acadiana hosted a CERT Workshop for 30 volunteers, a precursor to the complete CERT Training Course, to provide critical skills in emergency preparedness and response. Participants learned about disaster preparedness for the hazards that may impact their homes, neighborhoods, community and areas. The goal was to get their houses in order so they can be better prepared to help others if disaster strikes.

CISM+ Training

What do you say to someone who just lost everything? After serving countless people in those circumstances, we asked ourselves that question often. CISM+ (Critical Incident Stress Management Plus) training prepared us for those situations. Now 39 volunteers and staff are better equipped to respond to someone who has experienced trauma or loss. In the 14-hour course, we learned to deal with the mental, emotional and spiritual issues people face in times of disaster. All participants received a certification in Disaster Psychological First Aid and CISM/CISD (Critical Incident Stress Management/Critical Incident Stress Debriefing). We are so grateful for United Disaster Relief Network (UDRN), a Christian nonprofit based in Austin, for bringing their first off-site training to us. Our community will be better for it!

Disaster Roundtable

Love Acadiana staff and lead volunteers attended a disaster response round table at Church of the Highlands in Birmingham, Alabama, to glean wisdom from national agency representatives. Attendees also focused on building relationships with Christian counterparts from other churches and non-profits. Having likeminded connections we can call for backup or guidance is critical for all of us when disaster strikes.



DISASTER RESPONSE



Eight Days of Hope Rebuild - LaPlace, LA

Our strategic partners, Eight Days of Hope, brought 1,200 volunteers to LaPlace in April to rebuild 150 homes damaged by Hurricane Ida. Our volunteers and staff helped to prep for the rebuild by assessing homes in the weeks and months preceding the event. Shoutout to Mr. Rudy, one of our committed Love Acadiana volunteers, who enlisted for the whole deployment to help those in need. In eight days, 150 families were helped! We are blessed to have partners like this who love and serve Louisiana and the U.S.- all for the glory of God.

Inventory Prep Day

Having equipment ready to deploy for a storm season is crucial for disaster response. In April, a group of diligent volunteers spent a Saturday cleaning generators and dehumidifiers, organizing muck-out kits and inventorying supplies. Because of these efforts, we are ready to send the love of Jesus and critical equipment to those who need it at a moment's notice. Working side-by-side on prep events like this allows volunteers to build relationships that make them more efficient and effective when teamwork is critical, like responding to disasters.

Eight Days of Hope Rebuild - Lake Charles

Our team joined Eight Days of Hope leaders to assess and then to repair homes for the rebuild project December 3-10 in Lake Charles. In a period of nine months, SWLA residents were devastated by Hurricanes Laura, Delta and Zeta followed by the ice storm of February 2021 and a flood in May of 2021. More than two years after Laura, there are still so many families living with the devastation. Many were impacted by the storms, then taken advantage of by contractors or insurance companies, and are still living in unlivable conditions with nowhere else to turn. Despite all their loss, the people still have hope and welcomed the love of Jesus that we shared.

Hurricane Help for Single Mom

We partnered with OSC Opelousas to help rebuild a mobile home that sustained major damage from Hurricane Delta, so a single mom and her five children would have a place to call home. Volunteers replaced floors, walls, cabinets, repaired the roof, and ultimately brought beauty from disaster.



Love Acadiana and Catholic Charities partnered together in February to share the love of Jesus with a homeowner in Broussard who was still dealing with damage from Hurricane Delta 18 months prior. Thirty-four volunteers painted Ms. Princess' entire house, raked and bagged 1,250 pounds of pine needles and debris from the yard, replaced rotting boards, cut down trees, installed an appliance, and enjoyed a special prayer time in the front yard. To make the day complete, a neighbor surprised us with an enormous pot of gumbo for lunch.



With the help of dozens of volunteers, we were able to assist multiple families in two neighborhoods whose homes were damaged by the December tornado in New Iberia. In the days immediately after the storm, we organized volunteer teams to clean up debris and limbs, cut trees and tarp roofs, and love on families who desperately needed hope. Our Crisis Incident Stress Management (CISM+) training earlier in the year proved invaluable in helping our leaders minister to survivors. Thanks to our supporters who enable us to train and respond with the love of Christ and with excellence. At the time of this publishing, we are still involved in helping families to rebuild. SERVE DAY 2022



One of our favorite days of the year is Serve Day, where churches and Christian organizations worldwide follow Jesus' example and serve others in a big way. This year, we focused on S.J. Montgomery in Lafayette, Youngsville Middle School, Jeanerette High, Early Learning Center in St. Martinville, and The Truth Is Ministry in Opelousas. A total of 628 volunteers painted, landscaped, power washed and prayed over the people and projects where they served. In addition, volunteers set up a Vacation Bible School at a campus in St. Martinville where leaders taught 23 young children from the community about God's love.







The weekend before Thanksgiving, we had our 3rd annual God-is-Good Gobble Box outreach. This year was our largest yet, impacting nearly 4,000 lives with 640 boxes filled with everything needed for a Thanksgiving meal, including a turkey, Fezzo's bread pudding and a devotional book. With 44 drivers and 90 total volunteers, we distributed 640 Thanksgiving meals. We partnered with 13 churches and organizations across Acadiana, including Lafayette North and Southsides, Youngsville, New Iberia, Broussard, St. Martinville, Opelousas, Crowley, Lake Charles, Cutoff, Jennings and Eunice areas. Thanks to everyone who helped - whether donating, labeling, packing or distributing boxes. A special thank you to Fezzo's, Manuel Companies and Laborde Earles for their support.











More than 60 volunteers braved the cold on a Saturday morning in January to clean a neighborhood cemetery on Lafayette's Northside. Volunteers from all parts of Lafayette came together to rake up four tons of yard debris (which was Parish Proud's most successful event at that time), and made new friends in the process. The event served to acknowledge the dignity of those buried there and enhance the area for their loved ones living nearby.



In early August, just in time for the new school year, we partnered with The Gifting Grace Project for its Pack-the-Backpack event. We sorted multiple pallets of school supplies at Mendoza Ford, then packed and delivered 522 backpacks to bless children who meet the homeless criteria in five parishes. Thanks to generous community partners and more than 40 energetic volunteers between both organizations, those children had the materials needed to start the school year.





Love Acadiana partnered with OSC Broussard to organize and host the largest athletic banquet Westgate High School has ever had-with 450 attendees-to celebrate the football team's success! Their story is the kind movies are made of: from an 0-and-10 record just five years ago to state champs this year, through perseverance, discipline, great coaching, and a principal that stood beside them - all without a big budget or upscale equipment. The underdog-to-champion story is a testament to what young people can accomplish when leaders believe in them and pour into their lives, on and off the field. With the support of Principal Neely Moore, Coach Ryan Antoine mentored the young men on the team through incredible trials, both individually and as a team, to form this tenacious group of overcomers. The community united to sponsor championship rings which were given at the May event, and the outpouring of love was evidence to all of us

Love Acadiana Ribbon Cutting/Open House

After a decade of serving the community from borrowed and scattered locations, Love Acadiana has a place of its own. In September, we cut the ribbon on our new digs on Birdie Lane in Broussard, with the Broussard Chamber of Commerce, Mayor Ray Bourque, many pastors, donors, and volunteers in attendance to help us celebrate God's blessings

on this ministry. We now have our outreach offices, conference room and storage for all our equipment under one roof. Next time you're in the area, stop by to say hello!







Love Acadiana, OSC Broussard and the Hope Center teamed up in April to host a Family Day and Easter Egg Hunt in St. Martinville's Magnolia Park. The event drew over 60 volunteers and 150 children and their families to hunt 10,000 eggs! They also enjoyed cornhole, Kan Jam, rock painting, and refreshments from Raising Cane's Chicken Fingers. The best part was the relationships formed, connections made and invitations to celebrate Jesus, the real reason for the Easter season.



We spent the afternoon on Saturday, April 2, at West End Park celebrating Easter by serving the community with OSC New Iberia. More than 250 children and their families showed up to savor the day! We made new friends, great memories and divine connections in the community while creating fun activities for the participants to enjoy. There were basketball, volleyball and football games, rock painting for the young ones, and 10,000 Easter eggs to hunt! We hope that the West End community felt the love of Jesus, the resurrected Savior, through our efforts.





The supply drive in July and August brought together more than 10 local churches and organizations to gather much needed supplies to support six Acadiana pregnancy centers serving Lafayette, New Iberia, Opelousas, Eunice/Mamou, and Abbeville areas. In total, we distributed 15,000+ diapers (which will help more than 500 mothers!), 700+ boxes of wipes, car seats, bottles, pacifiers, clothing items, blankets, and hygiene products. The drive raised more than \$25,000 in baby supplies! We are grateful to everyone who donated and hosted drop-off locations. Providing baby items is one way to help moms and dads facing unplanned pregnancies.

Fans to Nursing Home Residents

As soon as one of our volunteers let us know that a local nursing home needed to cool off its residents while they were having A/C problems, we loaded up and delivered 50 box fans that day. It was one of those times when we had the resources at our fingertips and the Lord, once again, led us directly to the people who needed what He had already provided.



Broussard Jingle Jam Christmas Outreach

December 10 was our very first Broussard Jingle Jam. Love Acadiana partnered with OSC Broussard, Chart Industries and Cornerstone Cares to give 150 bikes and toys to children of Broussard and St. Martinville. The kids came to OSC to pick up their gifts, and enjoy hot cocoa, popcorn and Christmas music. We spread joy and Christmas spirit to all who came out for a gift, love and fellowship.

OSC Community Outreach

Love Acadiana partnered with OSC Lafayette to organize a gift distribution for the community on Christmas Eve. Food trays were delivered to local fire and police departments, as well as TV stations, and gift bags with coffee gift cards to various individuals working that night. They were hand delivered by church-goers leaving Christmas Eve service, many reporting that they were more blessed than those who received the gifts.

Christmas Extravaganza

Love Acadiana joined Harvest Center Church on E. Simcoe in its annual Christmas event for children in surrounding neighborhoods, and we were able to supply gifts for students from Dr. Raphael A. Baranco Elementary School.



SCHOOL OUTREACH



Saturday Serve at Early Learning Center in St. Martinville & OSC Broussard

Love Acadiana volunteers made a huge impact at the church, completing a clean-out of designated buildings and years of supplies to make way for new things God is doing there. On the same day, in order to maintain the safety and environment of the students at the Early Learning Center (ELC) in St. Martinville, we installed 300 feet of wood fencing along the back of their playground. Both children and teachers were surprised and excited to enjoy their outdoor space when they returned to school that Monday.

Saturday Serve at Westgate High School

We joined OSC Broussard to spruce up Westgate High's athletic rooms by pressure washing and cleaning the areas where the team prepares for games. The Tigers won the football state championship title this year even with the odds stacked against them. We were honored to serve the coach, principal and team, who persevered through so many trials, personally and together, to take home the win.

Saturday Serve at Youngsville Middle School

Love Acadiana partnered with OSC Lafayette to continue the good work that began at Youngsville Middle School on Serve Day in July. Nearly 40 volunteers showed up to love on the staff and students by organizing and decorating the teacher's lounge, painting the students' bathrooms and restriping the parking lot. Enhancing the learning environment goes a long way to improve morale and remind everyone on campus that they are loved by God and by us. As always, we had a blast doing it!

Saturday Serve at Acadiana Christian School

In July we partnered with OSC New Iberia to bless one of their most important ministries to families - Acadiana Christian School. Over 100 volunteers came out and served by painting, landscaping, cleaning, and even a little demolition of old playground equipment to make room for a new, safer area for the students to enjoy recess and outside activities.



During Volunteer Appreciation Month, we recognized 134 committed volunteers in various ways, ranging from sweet treats to drawings for gift cards. As the year came to a close, the top 30 volunteers of 2022 were honored with the coveted long-sleeve Love Acadiana t-shirts. One volunteer soared with over 120 hours, and six more had over 50 hours of service each. They lived out Philippians 2:3 before us: considering others more important than themselves, they looked not to their own interest but to the interests of others.
